SPECIAL RULES FOR YOUTH RABBIT SHOW (Read all rules carefully, including general rules found in front of this handbook that apply to all exhibitors.)

1. Any youth under the age of 18 years old may enter.
2. Each youth may enter 5 rabbits.
3. All animals **MUST** be tagged or tattooed to be entered in these shows.
4. All animals must be in leak proof carrying cages. All accidents will be cleaned up by the owners.
5. Children must be able to put their own animals on and off the judging tables.
6. Animals do not have to be purebred to be entered in the youth rabbit show.
7. Rabbits should be at least 12 weeks or 3 months of age to be entered in the youth show. Younger animals are not fully developed and do not show well.
8. Any animals showing signs of disease or illness will be removed from the show area to safeguard the health of the other animals.
9. Only animals judged Best of Breed will be eligible for the "Best of Show" award.
10. Breeds will only be announced twice before judging begins. Please pay attention so you can hear your breed called.
11. Special award winners must come from the blue ribbon group or previously judged winners. Bad table manners may disqualify an entry.
12. General faults, elimination's, and general disqualification's are overweight, underweight, hutch stains, broken toenails, crooked tails and legs, ear canker, sore hocks, scurvy, mange, abscesses, sore eyes, wolf teeth, tumors, ruptures, and infections.
13. Prize money for Sections 240-262 will be pro rated as follows:
 - Blue group (2X)
Entries are healthy specimens with good flesh and fur conditions and without general breed faults.
 - Red group (1X)
Entries are weak in flesh or fur condition; they may carry one fault, but no general disqualifications.
 - White group (1/2X)
Entries can have two or more faults.
